
Defeating body shame with body acceptance

In this semi-autobiographical fantasy, I find myself in a debate with an old preacher from Christian antiquity. His exhortation comes after a long dialogue in which he challenges my divided view of the body with that of the early church.

This fictional novelette actually narrates my real educational journey from 'body

shame' to 'body acceptance.' As a bivocational pastor and nurse, I've worked routinely with naked bodies for over 25 years. But, when asked why female nudity fails to bring the sexual temptations predicted by society, I still have no satisfying answer, even for myself. A wall in my mind, separating two opposite attitudes toward nakedness, blocks the simple truth I know as a nurse from ever confronting the stubborn taboos in my upbringing.

My enlightening encounter with a wiser past topples that mental wall, giving me a new perspective on life in Bible times, a much deeper theological understanding of human embodiment, and a pricked conscience about the embarrassing root cause of our culture's obsession with pornography. I will never be the same.
