One theme stood out in the <u>History of</u> <u>Christianity</u> videos: *the Gospel has been transforming lives down the centuries*. He who said, "*I will build My church*," rose on Easter to do it! People through the ages encounter a living Savior. His presence and promises outlive history's fickle ideals, inventions, and ideologies.

But have you heard of the *redaction of history*? To <u>redact</u> is to edit or revise: "*If facts back then aren't acceptable now, eliminate them!*" Thomas Jefferson did this by redacting and printing a New Testament with all miracles removed as fictitious. Today's public school texts skip over the rich religious heritage of America's Founding Fathers. Their legacy of faith is intentionally forgotten. Soon paintings of Washington kneeling to pray will be doubted as a myth added later, rather than known as a past reality.

Bible scholars also redact. In the 1800s, volumes were written exposing geographical inaccuracies in the Bible. As archeologists unearthed ruins of these supposed inaccuracies, it was the work of those scholars, not the Bible, that became the historical myth. Even today, some modern scholars speak against the



reliability of the New Testament, yet the spiritual conversion experience we see described in its pages reliably continues to occur among millions around the globe, despite their scholarly doubts.

Trust the Bible and Christ's promises. Jesus promised peace and rest to all who come to Him. His rising on Easter Day secured them. His sending of the Spirit at Pentecost provided them. No skeptic can shake away the realities of Easter faith and Pentecostal power that have fulfilled Christ's words: "*I will build My church*." It's not only history but the Church's present experience. Praise God!

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Personal Pulpit

RELIGIOUS, but not right with God? That may sound strange to you, but there are many religious people "hiding" from God. They may be sincere, but sincerity is not enough; they need the truth of God's Word.

Some people think that they are Christians automatically because they had Christian parents. Others presume that attending church or being baptized or sharing in Communion makes them Christians. These are all important Christian responsibilities, but if they have never committed their lives to Christ their efforts are hopeless.

The Bible -- from beginning to end -teaches that to be right with God we need a sacrifice for our sins: "Without shedding of blood is no remission [of sins]" (Hebrews 9:22). God has provided salvation through His Son who "once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God" (1 Peter 3:18).

Trying to be religious without Jesus Christ as one's Savior can be like taking a drug that distorts a person's reasoning. It is a delusion to think that performing a religious duty can make us right with God. Even leading a respectable life can never erase our sins. We all need a Savior.

The Bible teaches that salvation is God's

gift which we do not deserve, nor can ever earn. The Lord taught that salvation is through faith in Him alone: "He that believeth on Me has everlasting life" (John 6:47). His apostle Peter declared, "Through His name whoever believes in Him shall receive remission of sins" (Acts 10:43). The apostle Paul wrote of his Savior: "In whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins" (Ephesians 1:7). The apostle John testified, "As many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the children of God, even to them that believe on His name" (John 1:12).

God's Good News turns us from our own vain attempts to earn His pardon to Christ's complete salvation. John Wesley, the great evangelist of eighteenth-century England, strove for years to make himself acceptable to God by his own efforts. But he never found peace until he could say, "I trusted Christ and Christ alone for salvation. And an assurance was given me that He had taken away all my sins."

Are you religious, but not right with God? Then come to Him today -- just as we all must approach God, as sinners in need of a Savior. You can pray to God right where you are, believing that Jesus Christ died for your sins and claiming Him as your Lord.

Jesus Christ promises, "He that hears My word, and believes on Him who sent Me, has eternal life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death to life" (John 5:24).
