19-86-01-A WORD from God quiet time, God's Word, worship, obedience, rest, deliverance Ps.86:11

God can use a very small word to teach us how to live.

INTRODUCTION:

-Our **text** is a great prayer to begin a <u>quiet-time</u> with God- <u>Psa 86:11</u>, *Teach me your way, O LORD, and I will walk in your truth; give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name.* (This prayer assumes 3 things: 1) that <u>God</u> <u>can instruct the human mind</u> (He can <u>speak to us *individually*</u>); 2) that <u>humans can choose to obey God</u> (we can <u>hear from God</u> and <u>do what</u> <u>He says</u>); and 3) that <u>we need help staying on track in our relationship</u> <u>with God</u> (Our hearts get <u>divided</u> by <u>distractions</u> and <u>need to re-focus</u>). -[<u>At CFO camp</u>, in a creative writing session, I was waiting on some "word" from the Lord before writing. He gave me the word "W-O-R-D".] **HOM.idea**, and He did this with me, using each letter of WORD, starting with "W"...

- I. W Worship [Worship is love at its highest level: adoration]
 - A. We <u>can show our *adoration*</u> of <u>God's personality</u> through <u>praise</u> [<u>examples</u>–<u>Psa 117</u>, Praise the LORD, all you nations; extol him, all you peoples. For great is his love toward us, and the faithfulness of the LORD endures forever. Praise the LORD. – <u>Psa 108:3-5</u>, I will praise you, O LORD, among the nations; I will sing of you among the peoples. For great is your love, higher than the heavens; your faithfulness reaches to the skies. Be exalted, O God, above the heavens, and let your glory be over all the earth.]
 - B. We <u>can show our *adoration*</u> of <u>**God's presence**</u> through <u>*prayer*</u> [<u>Praying Hyde</u> always made a long silent pause as he came to God in prayer.]
 - C. We <u>can show our *adoration*</u> of <u>God's provision</u> for humanity through <u>proclaiming it to others</u>–<u>1Cor 1:21</u>, For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe.

TRANS: Christ's Cross proves that God's love for us is immense. Our *adoration* or *worship* in return is <u>the proper response to such a loving</u> God, and that *worship* will keep our heart focused in *reverent faith*.

II. O - Obedience [Obedience means harkening or listening in both OT & NT.]

A. We *listen* with *our intellect* by *studying* God's Word: *adopting* it as <u>our *world-view*</u> (how we see *everything in life* fitting together).

- B. We *listen* with *our heart* by *meditating on* God's Word: letting it *mold* <u>our attitudes and passions</u> with the *mind* and *heart* of God.
- C. We *listen* with *our will* by *practicing* God's Word: *embracing* it not just in <u>our *thoughts* and *feelings*</u> but in <u>our *words* and *actions*.</u>

TRANS: If *obedience* means *listening*, then we <u>can't just mechanically</u> "go through the motions" of *right behavior*. God calls us <u>not to follow</u> a *list of rules*, but to <u>live out *holiness* from the *heart*.</u>

- **III. R Rest** [*Rest* is <u>manifested in</u> a *peaceful relaxing*, *trusting*, and *waiting*]
- A. We <u>rest in God</u> by <u>remembering His care</u>– <u>Psa 116:7</u>, Be at rest once more, O my soul, for the LORD has been good to you. (When *our peace* is <u>disrupted</u> by upsetting circumstances, we can <u>regain</u> it by recalling <u>God's blessings from the past</u> [There's <u>psychological therapy</u> in the <u>song</u> "Count Your Blessings": Count your blessings \\ Name them one by one ... Count your many blessings, \\ See what God has done."].)
- B. We <u>rest in God</u> by trusting Him to faithfully <u>keep His promises</u> [<u>C.Spurgeon</u>: "The same God who directs the earth in its orbit, who feeds the burning furnace of the sun, and trims the lamps of heaven, has promised to supply thee with daily strength. While He is able to uphold the universe, dream not that He will prove unable to fulfil His own promises."]
- C. We <u>rest in God</u> by waiting on His timing-
 - <u>Isa 30:18</u> (NLT), So the Lord must wait for you to come to him so he can show you his love and compassion. For the Lord is a faithful God. Blessed are those who wait for his help. [<u>Milton</u>: "They also serve who only stand and wait."] (<u>Waiting *isn't easy* if we are *anxious* about something; in this sense, we may have to *work* at *resting in God*.)
 </u>
 - 2. [In <u>Emily Steele's allegory</u>, *Expectation Corner*, Adam Slowman finds the "Delayed Blessings Office" where <u>God keeps certain things prayed for until</u> the right time to send them. We must learn to *wait on the Lord*, realizing that *delays* aren't always *denials*. There are <u>unknown mysteries of love and</u> wisdom in *God's timing*. We often want to pick God's mercies green when He wants to send them when they're *ripe*.] (God's *timing* is perfect!)

TRANS: [Poem: "Wait on the Lord" – Not so in haste, my heart; / Have faith in God and wait; / Although He linger long, / He never comes too late. // He never comes too late; / He knoweth what is best; / Vex not thyself in vain; / Until He cometh, rest. // Until He cometh, rest; / Nor grudge the hours that roll; / The feet that wait for God / Are soonest at the goal.] W-O-R, and now the last letter...

- **IV. D Deliverance** [*deliverance* is *salvation*, *freedom*, *rescue* <u>**Psa 116:8**</u>, For you, O LORD, have delivered my soul from **death**, my eyes from **tears**, my feet from **stumbling**.]
 - A. God's <u>deliverance saves us from</u> "death" (our spiritual death is Satan's primary objective- <u>Rom.3:23</u> shows us <u>a crucial contrast</u>:
 - 1. (Yes), "the wages of sin is death," (that's a reality we can't ignore)
 - 2. (*But*), "the gift of God is eternal life in Jesus Christ our Lord." (that's the *reality* of the "Good News" for us and for all humanity!)
 - B. God's <u>deliverance sets us free from</u> "tears" (When <u>Satan</u> can't keep us dead in sin, he has a <u>back-up plan</u>: "If God gives them life, I'll make it so they can't enjoy it!" <u>But Jesus says</u> [John16:33], These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.)
- C. God's <u>deliverance *rescues us from*</u> "stumbling" (<u>Satan *trips* us up;</u> <u>his specialty</u> is deceptive *darkness*.... But <u>God's specialty is</u> <u>guiding light</u>- <u>Psa119:105</u>, Your word *is* a lamp to my feet And a light to my path.)

CONCLUSION:

-God can use a very small word to teach us.... "W-O-R-D" could be an *acrostic* for many other spiritual lessons. But these four areas I've mentioned <u>help to fulfill the latter part of our text</u>-<u>Psa 86:11b</u>, give me an *undivided heart, that I may fear your name.*

-Worship, obedience, rest and deliverance each contribute to uniting our hearts with reverent faith in God. Satan tries to conquer us by dividing our hearts. BUT by <u>adoring</u> our Creator, <u>absorbing His truth</u>, <u>anticipating His watch care</u>, and <u>accessing His deliverance</u>, we build into our lives <u>a united front</u> against the world, the flesh and the devil. -<u>By teaching us His truth</u>, <u>God plants a garden</u> in the soil of our heart, and <u>it leaves Satan no ground</u> in our lives. SO, in view of this W-O-R-D of <u>spend time daily</u> in your heart's garden, cultivating it with the Word of God. It will be <u>a blessing to you</u>, and inevitably <u>a blessing to</u> all those with whom you come into contact.
