43-01-03-The Glory of Our King

Incarnation, glory, grace, truth, exaltation John 1:14b

Christ's divine glory corrects all false opinions about God.

<u>INTRODUCTION</u>: (Scripture Reading: <u>John 1:14-18, 29-34</u>)

-We learned in <u>John 1:14a</u> that *The Incarnation makes cross-cultural* outreach our mandate. Here's the rest, <u>v.14b</u>: "We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." -The word "glory" [<u>doxa</u>=opinion, from "to think"] is in our words doxology and orthodox. Orthodox means "right opinion" or "straight thinking." A <u>right opinion of God leads us to praise Him</u> [<u>Doxology</u>].

-In our *fallen* human condition, *sin* distorts *right thinking*. [<u>Title</u> because] Jesus revealed the "*glory*" or *right opinion* of God. **HOM.idea**. But John expounds <u>v.14</u> *in reverse order*, to show us *first* that **Christ's glory**...

- I. Corrects a Wrong View of Merit– (*full of grace and truth*) <u>v.17</u>, For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.
 - A. <u>Law-keeping can lead to false trust in merit</u>– <u>Luke 18:11–12</u> [Jesus said a Pharisee] "stood up and prayed about himself: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men—robbers, evildoers, adulterers—or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get."
 - B. <u>OT Law has *truth* with no saving "*grace*"– <u>Rom 3:23</u>, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. (Because Jesus came "*full of grace and truth*," <u>He was *generous* with it...</u>)</u>
 - C. John said in <u>v.16</u>, From the fullness of his grace we have all received one blessing after another [<u>lit</u>. "grace in place of grace"] (<u>God wanted to</u> <u>bless us</u> as He taught in <u>Deut 28:2 (ESV)</u>, And all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you, if you obey the voice of the LORD your God. But *failure to obey* cancels all *human merit*.)

<u>**TRANS</u>**: Jesus warns in <u>John 5:39-40</u>, You diligently study the Scriptures because you think that by them you possess eternal life. These are the Scriptures that testify about me, yet you refuse to come to me to have life. *Our King's glory* is *"full of grace and truth,"* <u>saving us</u>, as <u>**Tit 3:5a**</u> says, "not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy." <u>Next</u> **Christ's glory**...</u>

II. Corrects a Wrong View of God- "the glory of the One and Only, who

- A. People may slander God when bad things happen in life.
- 1. But in a *fallen* world, <u>any decision He makes</u> involves *suffering*.
- 2. But we know God always makes the most loving choice? How?
- $B. \ \underline{In \ Jesus \ was} \ ``the \ glory \ of \ the \ One \ and \ Only, \ who \ came \ from \ the \ Father."$
 - 1. <u>He brought the *right opinion* [*doxa*]–<u>v.18</u>, No one has ever seen God, but God the One and Only, who is at the Father's side, has **made him known**.</u>
- 2. Jesus, coming <u>straight from God's heart</u>, says in <u>John 17:22</u> that He <u>shares His Father's "glory" with us</u>: "I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one.

TRANS: *Christian* unity is *Trinitarian* unity, brought to us by "*the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father.*" But it's a process– <u>2 Cor 3:18</u>, And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit. **Christ's glory** gives us a new experience of God. *And finally it*...

- III. Corrects a Wrong View of Jesus Himself— "We have seen his glory"

 <u>v.29</u> The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!"
 - A. John <u>was a *cousin* of Jesus</u>, but after seeing "*his glory*," John knew Jesus was *the Messiah*—<u>v.33</u>, "I would not have known him, except that the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is he who will baptize with the Holy Spirit."
 - B. At Pentecost, Jesus *baptized* His Church "with the Holy Spirit." <u>This</u> <u>isn't just a bit of history</u>– <u>Eph 5:18</u> [tells us] "be filled with the Spirit," not "drunk with wine" <u>or otherwise distracted</u> from *Kingdom living*.)
- C. <u>In "*his glory*," Jesus</u> "takes away the sin of the world" and "baptize[s] with the Holy Spirit." (The *Cross saves us; Spirit-filling sanctifies us*—we need both, and "*his glory*" gives us both.)

<u>CONCLUSION</u>:

-Christ's divine glory corrects all false opinions about God. John's explanation of "his glory" tells us to let go of merit-seeking to grasp "the fullness of his grace"; to let go of opinions unworthy of the Father as Jesus reveals Him; and to let go of any view of Jesus less than that of our Savior from sin and our Baptizer in the Holy Spirit. Jesus came to bring the right opinion [doxa] on everything divine "his glory" with us and manifest it in us as it was manifested in Him.
