The Gospel turns believers into a Good News reporters.

#### **INTRODUCTION:**

- -Previous sermon: "the heart of the Gospel." Today's: **title**. *Gospel*= *good news*; it's <u>only news</u> when announced. The Gospel is by <u>nature</u> is a message. It's not really *news*, if it's not *shared*.
- -<u>Everyday we are bombarded</u> with different kinds of *news*:
- #1-<u>impersonal</u> news: <u>interesting</u>, but <u>doesn't really affect</u> our lives [<u>train accident</u> in Iceland; <u>new species of iguana</u> discovered in the Pacific] #2-<u>important</u> news: indirectly affects us, but nothing we can do about it
- [Kennedy's assassination or 9-11 Attack: all America focused on these events] #3-imperative news: affects us directly; we must act on it ["The IRS next
- year is changing the deadline for tax returns to April 1st" ("April fools!")]
- -The <u>Gospel is *imperative news*</u> that we <u>must do</u> something about *when* we <u>hear it</u> or when we <u>have it</u>. Ultimately **HOM.idea**.
- -The <u>Apostle Paul</u> was one of those "*Good News reporters*" and our **text** today teaches from his life that **the sharing of the Gospel** is...
- **I.** Part of Our Whole-Hearted Service to God—<u>v.9a</u>, God, whom I serve with my whole heart in preaching the gospel of his Son...
- A. <u>Mat 6:21</u>, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (The <u>Gospel is a *heart*-treasure</u> that we <u>must unselfishly share!</u>)
- B. When the Gospel captures our hearts, it affects our...\*
- 1. \*<u>Interests</u> <u>v.8b</u>, your faith is being reported all over the world. (Paul's focus was once on destroying Gospel faith; now he focused on <u>reports</u> of its success. (Where's our attention? We must <u>look for news</u> of missions & ministries that secular media doesn't report.)
- 2. \*Prayer life ( how we pray and what we pray for):
  - a. First, we should thank God for the progress— $\underline{\mathbf{v.8a}}$ , First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you
- b. Then, we should ask for *more blessings*, <u>v.9b-10a</u>, ...constantly I remember you in my prayers at all times... (Remember: we may be <u>the answer</u> to the prayer! We may be <u>called</u> to be the <u>blessing!</u>)
- 3. \*<u>Direction</u> (going <u>from our knees onto our feet</u>)— <u>v.10b</u>, and I pray that now at last by God's will the way may be opened for me to come to you.

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- a. Prayer can give us *places* to go, *people* to see.
- b. Prayer can give our day a people-centered itinerary.

# TRANS: The Gospel turns believers into a Good News reporters.

[<u>First 2 letters</u> in the English word for *Gospel* (G - O) spell "*GO!*"] When the <u>Gospel captures our hearts</u>, we'll want to "*GO*" report this *Good News* to others. Next, <u>Paul shows that</u> **Sharing of the Gospel is...** 

### II. Part of the Reason for the Church [why we're "the church militant"]

- A. The *Church* means <u>team effort</u> (the **you** in <u>Mat 5:14-16</u> is <u>plural</u>, **You** are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let **your** light shine before men, that they may see **your** good deeds and praise **your** Father in heaven.)
- B. The *Church* means <u>team work</u> [<u>JFK's phrase</u> revised: "Ask not what the Church can do for you, but what you can do for the Church."]— <u>v.11</u>, *I long to see you so that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to make you strong...* 
  - 1. The *assembled church* is a place to *share* our spiritual blessings with others (It ought to be part of *why* we come to church!)
- 2. *Spiritual gifts* aren't for *show* or *status*, but to *bless* us as a *body* by *strengthening* our grip on the Gospel and *its grip on us!*
- C. The *Church* means <u>team support</u>— <u>v.12</u>, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith. (<u>Our sharing</u> can <u>encourage</u> others to <u>share</u>.) [One sister's <u>5-min. story</u> about sharing her faith was like a sermon.]

<u>TRANS</u>: Paul wanted "a harvest" of souls at Rome, but he knew that <u>evangelistic success</u> depends on the church's <u>spiritual health</u>. When Christians <u>fail to work together</u>, they usually <u>fail to share their faith</u>. That's one reason Jesus established <u>the Church</u>. He knew <u>we needed each other</u>. He gave <u>His Great Commission</u> in the <u>plural</u>, because He knew it was <u>a job for team effort</u>, for <u>team work</u>, and for <u>team support</u>. Everybody should <u>participate</u>. Finally, **the Sharing of the Gospel is...** 

## III. Part of the Responsibility of Gospel Faith

A. Gospel faith makes us rich—v.17–For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith." (The priceless gift of divine "righteousness" is a treasure that can't be earned. But although it's

<u>freely given</u> by *God's grace*, it has *spiritual strings attached....*)

- B. Our responsibility in receiving God's grace is to share it:\*
- 1. \*with all kinds of people-v.14, I am obligated both to Greeks and non-Greeks, both to the wise and the foolish. (The Gospel of God's grace meets the needs of every individual in every culture.)
- 2. \*with enthusiasm—v.15, That is why I am so eager to preach the gospel also to you... [Gk. "eagerness" = prothumos] (Why should we be eager Good News reporters? We've heard the best news in the world: Jesus came to pardon sins, bestow His righteousness, and destroy death with resurrection. Good News doesn't get better than that!)
- 3. \*without shame v.16a, I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes....
  - a. We can be *ashamed* of **our sins** that Christ carried to Calvary, but <u>not of the *forgiveness*</u> that His Cross purchased.
  - b. We can be <u>ashamed</u> of a former **unholy life**, but <u>not of the new</u> <u>life</u> that Jesus creates in us through the Holy Spirit!
- c. We can be <u>ashamed</u> of <u>keeping this good news to ourselves</u>. But <u>never should we be ashamed of telling a world facing the</u> <u>grave</u>, "There's divine hope!" Why? Because "HE IS RISEN!"

#### **CONCLUSION:**

- -The Gospel of Christ's victorious Cross and His glorious Resurrection "is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes."
- -If you have <u>not personally embraced this wonderful *Good News*, do so without delay! *Open your heart* to accept <u>His gracious gift of salvation</u>.</u>
- -But <u>if Gospel faith</u> is already our <u>heart-treasure</u>, then we should let our <u>gratitude</u> and <u>love</u> for <u>God</u> **turn us into** <u>Good</u> <u>News</u> **reporters.**
